RESOLVED:

That the Cambridge City Council endorses S. 2690, the Federal Domestic Assistance Information Act, and urges the Congress to adopt such a measure, and be it further

That the City Clerk communicate this endorsement to our congressional representatives, especially to Senator Kennedy who introduced the measure.
