L. Warren DeSaulnier, Lowell clerk magistrate

L. Warren DeSaulnier of Kennebunk Beach, Maine, a retired clerk magistrate of Lowell District Court, died Saturday at Massachusetts General Hospital. He was 73.

Born in Lowell, he lived in Chelmsford for many years before moving to Kennebunk Beach, Maine.

He attended Chelmsford schools and graduated from Keith Academy, where he played varsity baseball and football. He graduated from Boston College and played varsity football as part of the 1941 Orange Bowl team.

He graduated from New England School of Law, where he was class president.

He served in the U.S. Marine Corps during World War II.

Mr. DeSaulnier was clerk magistrate for Lowell District Court for more than 20 years.

He retired in 1992. He was formerly a member of the Massachusetts Parole Board.

Mr. DeSaulnier played professional baseball for the Boston Braves. An avid golfer, he was a former member of Vesper Country Club.

He is survived by his wife, Barbara A. (Mack); three sons, L. Warren Jr. of Chelmsford, William P. of New York City and Kennebunk Beach, and Peter A. of Lowell; a daughter, Donna of Kennebunk Beach; four grandchildren; a sister, Constance McIntee of Fort Lauderdale, Fla.; and many nieces and nephews.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated tomorrow at 11 a.m. at St. Mary Church, Chelmsford.

Burial will be in St. Mary Cemetery, Tewksbury.
