- WHEREAS: World AIDS Day is a reminder that AIDS is real and effects not only those living with the disease but also family and friends; and
- WHEREAS: The AIDS epidemic is not over, it continues to effect many individuals with increasingly larger numbers coming from African American and Latino communities; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has an extensive array of medical and support services and prevention activities to benefit the citizens of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge provides services to injection drug users to prevent further spread of the disease through needle exchange programs; now therefore be it

- RESOLVED: That the City of Cambridge acknowledges World AIDS Day and celebrates the lives of all those who have died from the disease; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City of Cambridge expresses appreciation for the individual and collaborative work performed on behalf of people living with AIDS; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City of Cambridge continues to support efforts that provide prevention education to all citizens.

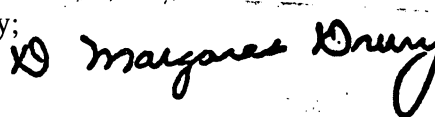

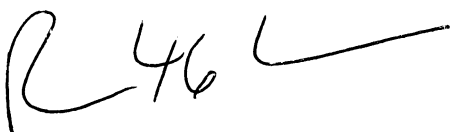
