# Rev. Henry Brooks, minister, teacher at Andover Newton

The Rev. Henry C. Brooks, an American Baptist minister who taught pastoral work to a generation of ministers at Andover Newton Theological School, died Friday in his home in Media, Pa. He was 72 and had a deficiency of the autonomous nervous system known as Shy-Drager syndrome.

Rev. Brooks was professor of psychology and clinical studies at the theological school in Newton from 1958 until his retirement in 1995. He was chaplain at Boston City Hospital from 1963 to 1993.

As director of the school's clinical pastoral education program, he trained more than 1,000 ministers and religious educators in spiritually based counseling and family crisis intervention. Many of his students got their first taste of clinical work at his office at Boston City Hospital, now Boston Medical Center.

Rev. Brooks was born in Alexandria, Va. He graduated from Storer College and Andover Newton Theological School, and earned a doctorate at Boston University.

He was a member of the General Board of American Baptist

Churches and its Ministers and Missionaries Benefit Board.

Upon his retirement in 1995, he was described in an Andover Newton publication as an "energetic administrator" who "defines warmth and caring." According to the newsletter, he was the man on campus to whom many turned when a crisis arose.

He leaves his wife, AEolus (Jones); a son, Steven, of Glendale, Calif.; two daughters, Evelyn V. Ridgeway of Drexel Hill, Pa., and Patricia of Silver Spring, Md.; his mother, Evelyn, of Alexandria, Va.; three brothers, Houston Jr. of Somerset, N.J., Leo, also of Alexandria, and Francis K. of Montpelier; and a sister, Nellie Quander of Alexandria.
