WHEREAS: The essence of life is impacted by one's ability to bequeath a legacy of good works by example; and

WHEREAS: **CLORAE DONEL HUNT EVERETEZE** was an exceptionally gifted individual endowed with the distinct amenities of outstanding character, intellect, and leadership; and

WHEREAS: **CLORAE** had a deep perception of the problems and social needs of others. She readily addressed and solved them in her own friendly, amenable manner; and

WHEREAS: **CLORAE's** valiant efforts in organizing the Tenants Council at Roosevelt Towers and contacting the Department of Housing and Urban Development resulted in restoration of that building and Tower. The Tower still stands as a visible memorial to her concern and determination to improve the quality of life for others; and

WHEREAS: In addition to an exceptional number of committees and organizations **CLORAE EVERETEZE** served as President of Cambridge Council of P.T.A.'s and in 1970 was appointed by City Manager James Sullivan, to lead the Cambridge Civic Unity Committee, an assignment she honored loyally until her death, and in 1976 Governor Michael Dukakis appointed her to the Social Economic Opportunity Council to study and recommend all types of State Housing and Patricia Harris, the head of H.U.D., assigned her to the National Advisory Board to study Housing and she later became a National Representative of Public Housing; and

WHEREAS: **CLORAE EVERETEZE**, a charter member of the Wellington-Harrington Citizens Committee and Neighborhood Development Corporation was one of the founders of the Just-A-Start Program; and

WHEREAS: **CLORAE**, a member and subsequent president of Isaac Wilson Taylor Post VFW, fought for veterans rights at Chelsea Soldiers Home and Bedford Hospital; and

WHEREAS: For many years prior to her death in 1978 **CLORAE EVERTEZE**, the mother of eight children, grandmother, confidante and friend, generously devoted much of her time, energy and love serving as a mother figure to generations of children who attended the United Parish Church in Brookline; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council applauds and commends the dedicated selfless and fruitful life of **CLORAE DONEL HUNT EVERETEZE** and appreciate her inestimable contributions to the betterment of life in the city of Cambridge.
