Represents the Subscriber  
Anna L. Moring of said Cambridge, Quincy  
Street, that the City Surveyor of Highways for  
many months past, without the approbation of the  
Mayor & Alderman, or any City authority, in writing,  
has caused a water course in said Quincy Street  
occasioned by the wash of said street to be so  
constructed & conveyed as to incommode the house  
& the main entrance & gateway leading thereto,  
and to obstruct the passage way, making it  
unsafe & dangerous for vehicles & carriages,  
passing in & out from said street to the dwelling  
house, and a matter of complaint by the owners  
& drivers of such vehicles. She further says that  
at considerable expense on the part of the owner  
iron tubes & an under ground drain were laid  
by the owner at the gate, which were torn  
up by the City authorities & the street left dangerous  
as aforesaid, & that she has requested the Superintendent  
of Streets to repair the same she having no power or  
authority, but he neglects & refuses to repair the  
said street. Being aggrieved, she therefore complains  
to said Mayor & Alderman under the 10<sup>th</sup> section  
of the 44<sup>th</sup> Chapter of the General Statutes -
