PROFESSIONAL HISTORY

1971 to date

Construction Engineer - Camp Dresser & McKee
Complete charge of various projects. Responsible for providing all engineering services during construction including: supervising of resident engineers and inspectors; maintaining progress scheduled and budgets; preparing periodic payment estimates and reports to various government agencies; carrying out on-site liaison between clients, contractors and designers; reviewing and approving equipment and material submittals by contractors. Estimated construction costs of 5 projects, approximately \$23 million.

1969 to 1971

Project Engineer: Camp Dresser & McKee
Responsible for design of 5 miles of 96-inch diameter intercepting sewer in tunnels and 2 miles of 96-inch diameter outfall for the Salt Creek Reclamation Plant for the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago. Estimated cost is \$20 million. Also project engineer on report to the city of Cambridge, Massachusetts, which included improvements to water supply, distribution system and expansion of water filtration plant to 36 mgd. Made recommendations for financing cost of improvements estimated at \$750,000 per year for 20 years. In charge of construction for approximately \$650,000 of annual improvements for last 3 years.

1969 to 1970

Senior Engineer: Camp Dresser & McKee
In charge of civil and sanitary design for Sydney, Australia water filtration plant with ultimate capacity of over one billion gallons. Estimated cost of project which included development of sewerage, drainage, roads and grading on 10 square mile site is approximately \$53 million.

Coordinating Engineer: Camp Dresser & McKee
Responsible for coordinating engineering design of five consultants working jointly on 150 mgd Salt Creek Water Reclamation Plant for the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago. The plant employs a two-stage activated sludge tertiary treatment process. Estimated cost is \$50 million.

1964 to 1968

Project Engineer - Camp Dresser & McKee
Designed and supervised construction of water and wastewater works under the direction of a senior engineer. The waterworks projects, which included treatment and distribution and the pollution abatement projects, which involved interceptors and wastewater treatment plants, were located in several New England municipalities.

1963 to 1964

Resident Engineer - Camp Dresser & McKee
In charge of construction of waterworks, sewerage and wastewater treatment facilities in Massachusetts and New Hampshire communities.

1962 to 1963

Field Engineer - Metcalf & Eddy, Consulting Engineers
Supervised construction of municipal airport and various building foundations under direction of resident engineers.
