- WHEREAS:** This being so, we must insure that departments work collectively to resolve problems within our City, and
- WHEREAS:** One of the most essential jobs that we have been not succeeding with, both at the national level and here in Cambridge, is bridging the gap between school and employment, therefore be it
- ORDERED:** That the City Manager be requested to confer with the Director of the Cambridge Office of Manpower Affairs and the Superintendent of Schools in order to develop effective employment and training programs, particularly for Cambridge Youth.
