

## City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, Dec 28 1887

Resolved,

~~That~~ That the public necessity and convenience require that Charles River Street, shall be extended from its present northeasterly terminus, crossing Mount Auburn Street to Bow Street, by taking for such purpose a certain parcel of land shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, dated December 9, 1887, said land being bounded and described as follows: Beginning on the northerly line of Mount Auburn Street at a point where the easterly line of Charles River Street, produced, intersects said northerly line of Mount Auburn Street; thence running northerly by the said easterly line of Charles River Street, produced, about thirty three feet (33) to the southerly line of Bow Street; thence running westerly on the said southerly line of Bow Street about forty (40) feet; thence turning and running southerly by a line parallel with and forty feet distant from said easterly line of Charles River Street, produced, about twenty eight (28) feet, to Mount Auburn Street.

thence running easterly on the westerly line of Mount Auburn Street, forty (40) feet to the point of beginning, - containing about Eleven Hundred and eighty (1180) square feet, more or less; and that the grade of the said proposed extension of Charles River Street shall be established, and for that purpose it is necessary to take and lay out as a public street or way of the said city, with the name of Charles River Street, all that parcel of land hereinbefore bounded and described, the said land belonging to Hyson Purcell, - and whereas, due notice has been given of the intention of this Board to take the said land for the purpose aforesaid, as appeared by the return on the order of notice issued therefor, - it is therefore

Ordered,

That the parcel of land hereinbefore described, be and the same hereby is taken

and laid out under the provisions of law, authorizing the assessment of betterments, as a public street or way of the said city, with the name of Charles River Street, and the grade thereof is established according to a plan of such extension and profile of the grade, made by W. P. Barbour, City Engineer, dated December 9. 1887, and deposited in his office; and this Board doth adjudge that the expense of extending, and establishing the grade of said Charles River Street, as aforesaid will amount to the sum of One Hundred Dollars, (\$100.00) and that the damage to the estate of Hyson Pencil, a part, or the whole of which is taken as hereinbefore stated is as set down in the following
