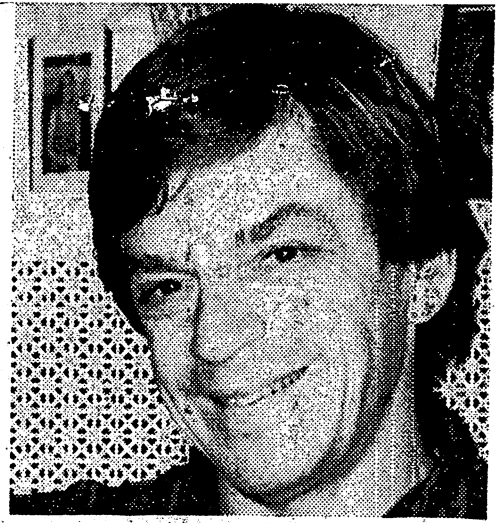

John A. Rutter, at 48

Rindge & Latin School teacher

A funeral service will be held today for John A. Rutter, an English teacher at Cambridge Rindge & Latin School for 25 years.

Mr. Rutter died of cancer Friday in his home in Somerville. He was 48.

He was born in Springhill, Nova Scotia. He moved to Cambridge with his family in 1959.

He graduated from Cambridge High and Latin School and earned bachelor's and master's degrees in English at the University of Massachusetts.

He was the director of the debating team and yearbook adviser at Cambridge Rindge & Latin and was also involved with the school's literary magazine.

He was a member of the vestry at Christ Church in Cambridge, where he also taught Sunday school.

He enjoyed hiking and writing poetry, and collected model trains.

He leaves his wife, Kathryn L. (Kenney); a son, Andrew; a daughter, Megan; his mother, Marion (Bird) Rutter of Somerville; two sisters, Judy Brown of Canada and Shirley Tammick of Pembroke; and a brother, David of Somerville.
