The Values of Scouting

Does Scouting offer more than fun in the outdoors? The answer found in a recently completed Harris study is a resounding **YES!**

More than eight in ten adult men (84%) who were Scouts as boys agree that "the values I learned in Scouting continue to be very important to me."

Scouts with five year's tenure are more likely than non-Scouts to

- Assume a leadership role in clubs or school organizations.
- Put the needs of others before themselves.
- Make the most honest, not the easiest, decisions.
- Value education and the environment.

Men who were Scouts for five or more years as boys are more likely than men with no Scouting experience to

- Graduate from high school (98% versus 83%).
- Graduate from college (40% versus 16%).
- Earn annual household incomes of \$50,000 + (33% versus 17%).

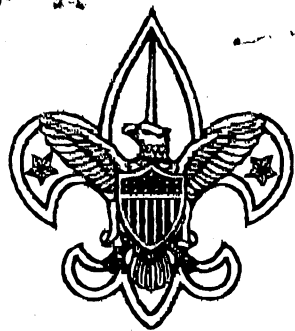

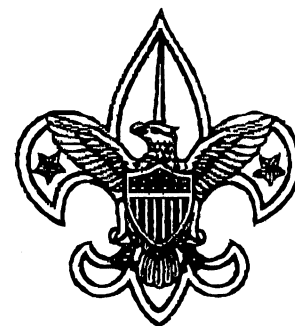
