Whereas,
Ordered, The Cambridge Public Library building was dedicated to public uses in June last, and has since been visited daily by large numbers of ladies, school-children, and citizens, who have been greatly inconvenienced because no street crossings have been put down, it is therefore

Ordered, That the Superintendent of streets is hereby directed to lay suitable crossings upon Broadway at the intersections of Northbridge Street and Irving Street, and at the intersections of said Northbridge and Irving Streets, with Cambridge Street, - without delay. The expense of said crossings to be charged to the appropriation for Street Department, (Paving.)
