Fran was one of the first 100 sisters of that order. For sixteen years she ran their homes for the elderly. In 1956 she left the order due to illness. She returned to Boston, after a long rest she went back to nursing working at different hospitals in Boston. Fran ended up in Cambridge at the ~~Sancta~~ ^{Santa} Maria Hospital where she worked for 15 years. She left Santa Maria in 1983 and joined the City of Cambridge at Neville Manor where she remained doing what she did best, taking care of the elderly. She served the City of Cambridge for seven years. at the age of seventy she decided it was time to retire to finish her golden

years with her daughter Barbara
and her two grandsons, Scott
