In Board of Aldermen, May 22, 1861.

Ordered, That due notice be given that it is the intention of this Board to lay out a new street in Wards One and Five, from a point near Atwill's Store on North Avenue to Vassal Lane at a point nearly opposite the street leading to the Reservoir of the Cambridge Water Works; the same to be laid out over what is now called "Walden Street" from North Avenue to the Bridge over the Fitchburg Railroad, and forty feet in width; and to be laid out fifty feet in width south of said Bridge; said Street to be laid out over lands of Henry Potter, Abel Willard, L. P. Bond, B. F. Wyeth, William Ward, James Wyeth, 2^d, Parker and Dana, Heirs of Asa Clemmlock, Heirs of Royal Stinson, and any other lands which it may be necessary to take for that purpose; and that any and all parties interested in the question of said laying out may appear and be heard at the regular meeting of this Board to be held on Wednesday, the fifth day of June next, at eight o'clock P.M. -

In Board of Aldermen, Nov. 21, 1860.

Resolved, - That the public convenience and necessity require that a new street be laid out in Wards One and Five, from North Avenue to Vassal Lane.

Therefore Ordered, That a street be laid out from North Avenue, at a point near Atwells' Store, over land of Henry Potter, Abel Willard, L. O. Bond, B. F. Wyeth, William Ward, Jonas Wyeth, 24, Parker and Dana, Heirs of Asa Clunbrook, and Heirs of Royal Stinson, to Vassal Lane, at a point nearly opposite the street leading to the Reservoir: said street to be forty feet in width, from North Avenue to the Bridge over the Fitchburg Railroad, and fifty feet throughout the part thereof South Westward of the said Bridge, - as delineated on a Plan drawn by W. A. Mason & Co., Surveyors, dated Sept. 7, 1857, and now before this Board; - and that, for this purpose, so much of the land belonging to the persons above named, as is included within the lines of said street, as delineated on said Plan, be taken for public use, and be laid out and established as a public highway.

Ordered, That damages occasioned by the taking
of said land for the purpose above mentioned,
be estimated and awarded as follows:—

To Henry Potter the sum of Forty Dollars.
