In the year our thousand eight hundred and sixty seven:

An Ordinance

in addition to the Ordinance in relation to Streets:

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:

The first and second Sections of said Ordinance shall not apply to any Street, so far as the same shall be contiguous to ^{and parallel with} any other Street or way ^{already} ~~thereof~~ accepted, or laid out, or otherwise a public way.
