COUNCILLOR RUSSELL

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge and its citizens were shocked and saddened by the senseless tragedy that occurred on September 18th which involved students from CRLS; and

WHEREAS: Numerous support groups have met, after the fact to discuss various ways of dealing with this situation; and

WHEREAS: Each year, during budget hearings, the Commissioner of Peace and Nuclear Disarmament reports that issues around peace and non-violence are a part of student life in this city; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Commissioner of Peace and Nuclear Disarmament report to this City Council exactly what is being done by that commission to foster non-violence and peaceful attitudes within our schools, as they relate to our own Cambridge community, and its co-existence with those who live here either as permanent residents or as students; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to coordinate the assembly of a comprehensive report from all parties working on preventative measures and programs as they relate to community violence.
