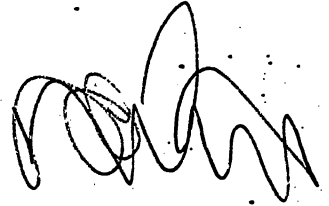

ORDER ADOPTED
