

CAMBRIDGE SAFE ENERGY PETITION

In accordance with Chapter 53, Section 18A, of the Massachusetts General Laws, the undersigned registered voters in the City of Cambridge petition the Cambridge City Council to place the following non-binding public opinion advisory question on the November 6, 1979, city election ballot:

"Should the Cambridge City Council actively encourage building insulation, energy conservation, and the use of solar power and other safe renewable energy sources in the city, thereby saving Cambridge residents money and creating new jobs, and request the state and federal governments not to license the construction or operation of any new nuclear power plants."

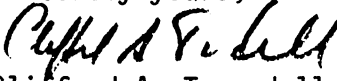
