
ORDERED:

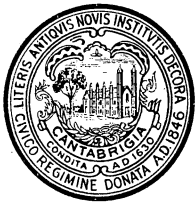

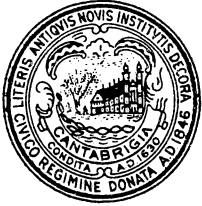
§ 99. Advance Payments of Retirement Allowances to Employees of Cities, Towns or Counties, Authorized.

The treasurer of any city, town or county which accepts this section may make advance payments in an amount not to exceed any retirement allowance actually due to employees of such city, town or county who are eligible for, and who have filed applications for, retirement, during such period as is necessary for the processing of such applications for retirement, and shall establish rules and regulations governing such payments. This section shall take effect upon its acceptance in a city by vote of the city council, subject to the provisions of its charter; in a town by vote of the voters at a town meeting; and in a county by vote of the county commissioners. § 100. Pensions for Widows of Certain Fire Fighters and Police Officers Who Are Killed in the Performance of Duty.

Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter or any other law, if a fire fighter while in the performance of his duties and as the result of an accident while responding to or returning from an alarm of fire or any emergency, or while at the scene of a fire or any emergency is killed or sustains injuries which result in his death, or if a police officer while in the performance of his duties and as the result of an assault on his person is killed or sustains injuries which result in his death, there shall be paid to the widow of such fire fighter or such police officer an annual amount of pension which shall be equal to the amount of salary which would have been paid to such fire fighter or such police officer had he continued in service in the position held by him at the time of his death; provided, however, that the amount of pension immediately payable shall be equal to the maximum salary set for the position whether or not such police officer or fire fighter had reached the maximum at the time of his death. Any pension payable to a widow under this section shall be paid to her so long as she remains unmarried. In the event of the death or remarriage of any widow eligible to receive a pension under this section, and in case there is any child of such deceased fire fighter or police officer, there shall be paid to the guardian of each such child the sum of three hundred and twelve dollars per annum until such time as such child shall have attained age eighteen, or if there is any child of such deceased fire fighter or police officer who is over age eighteen and who is physically or mentally incapacitated from earning, there shall be paid to such child or to the guardian, if any, the sum of three hundred and twelve dollars per annum.

The benefits provided by this section shall be in the alternative to the benefits provided by any other section of this chapter; provided, however, that if any such deceased fire fighter or police officer was a member of a contributory retirement system established under the provisions of section
