In Board of Aldermen, May 5. 1868

The Committee on Finance submitted a Report on the Petitions of Levi S. Cushing, jr. and John C. Farnham, recommending that the compensation of the Board of Assessors be established at \$3,000 per annum and that of the Assisted Assessors at \$4. per day:—recommending also that the salaries of certain other City Officers to whom an extra compensation has annually been allowed for several years past, be established by Ordinance.

The Report was referred, in concurrence, to the Committee on Ordinances, with instructions to report an Ordinance in accordance with the suggestions made by the Committee.
