In Common Council, Sept. 19. 1860.

Ordered, The members of the Committee on Roads and Bridges, on the part of this Board, to whom was referred the Order laying out a new street from Dublin Street to Garden Street, and also the further Order estimating and awarding land damages occasioned thereby: which Order passed the Board of Aldermen Aug. 29th have considered the same and moved respectfully

Resolved:-

That, in their opinion, said new street ought to be laid out from the end of Dublin Street, at the Fitchburg Railroad, over land of Solomon Sargent, and Messrs Parker & Dana, as delineated on the Plan referred to in said Order; but that it is inexpedient to lay out said street over the land of Jonas Wyeth, 2^d - William Hill, and Mr. Bourlay, -

If Walden Street should hereafter be extended, as has been proposed, from North Avenue to and across Garden Street, there would be an easy communication from the new street, through said Walden Street, to Garden Street; at the same time the distance would be shortened but a few rods by running through land of Wyeth, Hill and Bourlay, as contemplated by the Order, while the expense for land damages would be considerable.

It is therefore recommended that the Order laying out said street be amended by inserting the word "and" after the words "Solomon Sargent" - so that it will read - "over land of Solomon Sargent and Parker and Dana", - and by striking out the words, "Jonas Wyeth 2^d, William Hill, and Bourlay, to Garden Street", - and that the Order estimating and awarding land damages be stricken out:-
