to which were referred the papers relating
to the taking of land of Caleb Leland
at the junction of North Avenue & Milk
Street, with instructions to report the amount
of land & an estimate of damages, having
attended to the duties assigned them, would
respectfully

Report

That, according to the surveys & plans of
the City Engineer the lot of land to be taken
contains 4944 Square feet, for which your
committee recommend an award of
65 cents per foot, amounting to \$3213.60
when the proprietor shall have released the
City of all claims by tenants.

Your committee made no estimate
of the buildings except that, in adjudging the
award for the land, they assumed that the
buildings would remain the property of the present
proprietor & he be allowed to remove the same
within a reasonable time at his own expense

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the safety and convenience of the inhabitants require that Milk Street, in Ward Five, should be widened by taking for this purpose the land of Caleb Leland, lying between said Milk Street and North Avenue:

ORDERED, That due notice be given to said Caleb Leland, and all other persons interested, that this Board intends to widen Milk Street before mentioned, by taking a portion of their land and laying out the same as a public street; and also that due notice be given to all persons and parties owning or having any rights in estates that will be benefitted by the said proposed widening of said Street, that this Board intends to assess a portion of the expense thereof upon the estates so benefitted according to law — and that

In Board of Aldermen, April 27 1870.

Whereas it is adjudged by this Board, that the public necessity and convenience require that Clark Street, in Ward Five, should be widened on its South-Western side, by taking for this purpose the land of Caleb Leland lying between said Clark Street and North Avenue, in accordance with the Report of the Committee on Roads and Bridges, this day submitted to the Board,

Ordered, That said land of Caleb Leland, lying between Clark Street and North Avenue, be taken for public use and laid out as a part of said Clark Street, and a public way, the same being delineated on a certain Plan drawn by J. G. Chase, City Engineer, dated April 20, 1870, and now before this Board.

Ordered, That damages for the land so taken be estimated and awarded as follows.

To Caleb Leland -

\$ 3,213.60

the buildings standing on said land to be removed by said Leland, and releases to be obtained by him from his lessees of all claims on their

frank, before the damages awarded shall be paid to him.
Ordered: That four weeks be allowed
for the removal of said bridge from said
land.
