In response to Councillor Wolf's inquiry about 1) whether or not "talking books" could be purchased for patients, and 2) could a program of performances for the patients be paid for out of this appropriation, please be advised that these recommendations can be made to the Hospital Public Art Committee.

Regarding whether or not preference can be given to Cambridge artists, art panelists selecting artists are encouraged to implement a "concentric circle" philosophy. If the best artist for the project can be found in Cambridge, s/he is selected; if not Cambridge, then greater Boston, if not greater Boston then Massachusetts, etc. There are no quotas set but CAC encourages panelists to help us support local artists.

The Ordinance and its implementation guidelines make CAC responsible for putting together a Site Committee of people with a vested interest in the site (in this case, Hospital personnel, patients, visitors, the architect, the Executive Director of the Historic Commission) to work with a panel of three art professionals qualified to review the work of hundreds of artists and knowledgeable about what artists can contribute to a project.

Together these people determine the best use of the art budget and how to integrate art into the new facility for the maximum enjoyment of the public.

Attached is an order requesting the transfer of \$100,000.00 from the Public Investment Fund Health and Hospital Services Extraordinary Expenditures Account to the Public Celebrations Extraordinary Expenditures Account to provide funds for the One Percent for the Arts Program. An allotment of \$100,000.00 for this program was included in the \$40,000,000.00 appropriation for the construction of the new ambulatory care center and renovations to the existing facility.
