- WHEREAS: Julia Child has always sought to encourage young people to have an interest in the culinary arts and to enter the culinary profession and has been a strong supporter of the culinary program in the Cambridge public schools throughout her years in the City of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Through the decades Cambridge residents have come to know Julia Child as a friend and neighbor, someone they ran into on the street, at the grocery store, the hardware store, or while dining out; and
- WHEREAS: After her long years of residence in Cambridge Julia Child is leaving our City and returning to her native California; now therefor be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council honor Julia Child for her long years of residence in Cambridge, her work as a teacher advancing the culinary arts; and her involvement in our community by naming Wednesday, November 7, 2001 Julia Child Day in Cambridge; and be it further
