Dear Mr. Sullivan:

In March CASCAP will celebrate its twenty-fifth anniversary. For a quarter century this agency has provided homes and supportive services to Cambridge and Somerville citizens. I am proud of our past and hopeful about our future. The dedication and hard work of many people led us to where we are today. I am grateful for everyone who has been part of CASCAP. I am especially thankful for your on-going support. Your gift of \$50 last year was used for *General Support* as you designated. Please continue your support as you make charitable contributions for 1997.

CASCAP remains true to its tradition of providing attractive, affordable housing and effective services. Today we house 157 individuals in Cambridge and Somerville. Some of these individuals have been living in CASCAP housing for nearly twenty-five years benefiting from the continuity a stable organization provides. We also serve an average 220 individuals each month in Cambridge Housing Authority residences. In addition, a housing resource team offers representative payee services and housing location services to homeless individuals and families.

CASCAP continues to train men and women with psychiatric disabilities to work as professionals in the human service field. Sixty graduates of the Consumer Provider Program have joined the ranks of local human service agencies. Their collective voice was heard on Beacon Hill this spring when funding for the Consumer Provider Program was cut from the Commonwealth's budget. Together they told legislators powerful stories of how meaningful work changed their lives. The funding was reinstated and class number seven is under way.

CASCAP remains committed to creating affordable housing through its affiliate, SHARE Associates (formerly CASCAP's housing development department). SHARE is renovating several lodging houses for people with mental retardation, and creating twenty-one assisted living apartments in an abandoned mid-Cambridge nursing home.

Because there is such a pressing need for assisted living housing for low and moderate income elders, CASCAP is working with three other organizations to redevelop the Mayor Michael J. Neville Manor. The plans include seventy-two assisted living units, and a new 100 bed skilled nursing home.

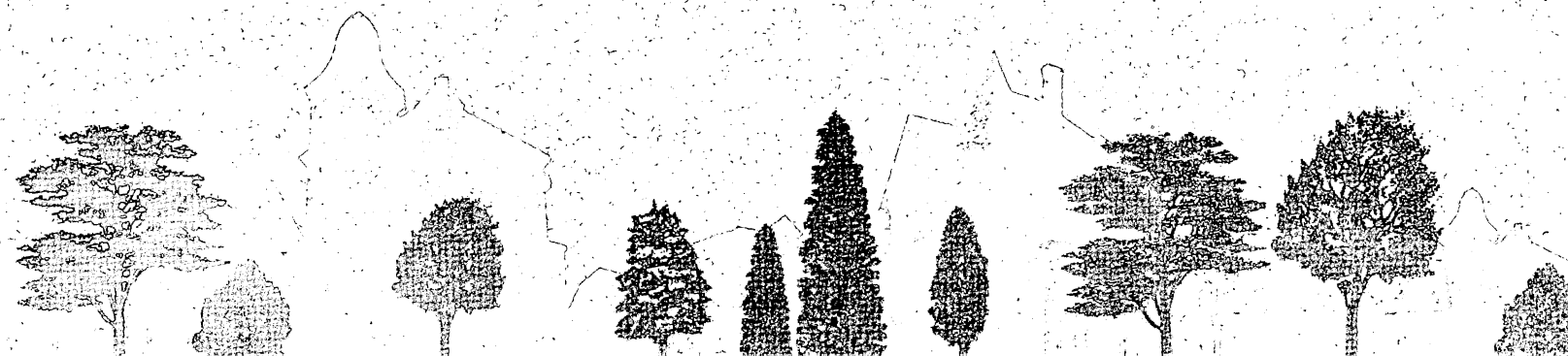
