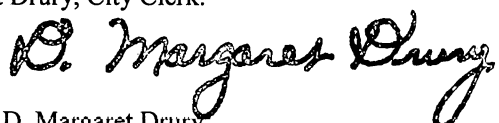
- WHEREAS: Congresswoman Maxine Waters, 35th District of California, will be visiting Cambridge on March 12 and 13, 2004 to speak at Harvard University and at the Saturday School; and
- WHEREAS: Congresswoman Waters represents a large part of South Central Los Angeles, the Westchester community and the diverse cities of Gardena, Hawthorne, Inglewood and Lawndale; and
- WHEREAS: Representative Waters was elected to her seventh term in the House of Representatives with 77.6% of the votes in her district; and
- WHEREAS: Congresswoman Waters is currently Chief Deputy Whip of the Democratic Party and Co-Chair of the House Democratic Steering Committee; she serves in the House Committee on Financial Services and is the ranking member of its Subcommittee on Housing and Community Opportunity, and she also serves on the Committee on the Judiciary; and
- WHEREAS: Congresswoman Maxine Waters is one of the most powerful women in American politics today and a fearless and outspoken advocate for women, children, people of color and poor people; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record welcoming Congresswoman Maxine Waters to Cambridge on behalf of the City of Cambridge; and
