IN CITY COUNCIL

May 15, 1978

ORDERED:

That in accordance with the provisions of the General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge, Chapter 3, Section 3-2, the Commissioner of Public Works be and hereby is authorized to grant a permit to Peter D. Bennett to hold a weekly flea market/bazaar on Saturdays from 9:00 A. M. to 6:00 P. M. for the period commencing May 20, 1978 through October 31, 1978 in front of the premises at the First Parish Unitarian Church at the corner of Church Street and Massachusetts Avenue, provided that no such permit shall be granted to exceed more than twenty-five per cent of the width of the sidewalk from the property line of the premises in front of which said flea market/bazaar shall be installed and providing further that before erecting the above named flea market/bazaar, the petitioner shall file with the City Clerk a satisfactory bond in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) conditioned to save harmless the City of Cambridge for damages arising from the construction, maintenance and use of said flea market/bazaar.

We have met with representatives of the Harvard Square Business Association and the Cambridge Arts Council. In the course of these meetings we have agreed on a number of policies and guidelines for outdoor operation, including the following:

There shall be a policeman or security officer on duty at the Market.

There shall be no on-street parking by the Market, or by persons assisting or selling at the Market.

The Cambridge Arts Council shall be consulted regarding questions of aesthetics and design.

Tables will not be permitted to occupy more than the space allotted by the permit.
