WHEREAS: It is expected that 500 Black College Students will unite to attend the Annual BBSN Holladay on September 27, 2008; and

WHEREAS: The **Boston Black Student Network (BBSN)** is a student-operated non-profit organization comprised of African-American students who attend colleges and universities in and around the Boston Area. The primary purpose of **BBSN** is to create and maintain an open line of communication among the colleges and universities in and around Boston in order to best utilize the knowledge, talent, and resources of the black community. The organization also serves as a bridge between African-American Boston college students and Boston businesses. BBSN's business partners have access to students who will soon enter the workforce; and

WHEREAS: **HollaDay** is an event that serves as a networking initiative for the 500+ Black college student attendees encouraging healthy communication between the black communities of the various colleges and universities present. Also, because most black college students are new to (or still unfamiliar with) the Boston area, this event provides an opportunity for students to explore Boston's businesses and discover resources that cater to their community - specifically various business, newspapers, and restaurants in their new hometown; and

WHEREAS: As in the past, over 500 college students will be present for networking activities, music by students from the area, and as well as a Greek StrollOUT competition and a speech by City Councilor Chuck Turner. Most importantly, **HollaDay VI** will include a Voter Registration Drive hosted by JAMN 94.5. This event serves as a prime arena for social networking as well as a great opportunity for students to get more involved in the Boston community; now therefore be it
