In the year One Thousand Eight-Hundred and Fifty-nine.

An Ordinance

relating to the Public Health.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:—

Sec. 1. No person shall remove or carry, in, along, or through, any of the streets, squares, courts, lanes, avenues, places, or alleys, of the City of Cambridge, any ~~house dirt~~ house offal, or any refuse substances, either animal or vegetable from any of the dwelling-houses or other places in the City, unless such person so removing or carrying the same, and the mode in which the same shall be removed or carried, shall have been expressly licensed by the Mayor and Aldermen, upon such terms and conditions as they shall deem the health and interest of the City require.

Sec. 2. Any person who shall offend against any of the provisions of the foregoing section shall forfeit and

pay a sum not less than one dollar nor more than  
twenty dollars.
