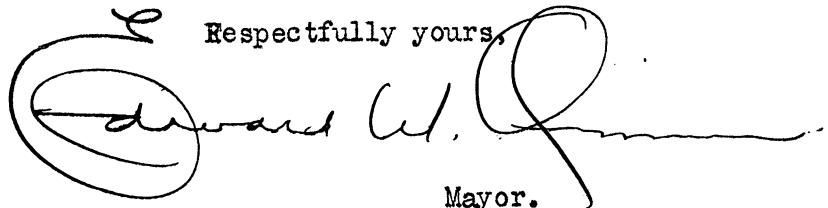
The Honorable, the City Council:

With feelings of sorrow I announce to you the death of Dr. John E. Dwyer which occurred at his home in this city June 10.

Dr. Dwyer a native son of Cambridge and had served his fellow-citizens faithfully and well in many ways. During the years 1903, 1904, 1905 and 1906 he was a member of the Park Commission, and in the years 1914, 1915 and 1916 he served as a member of the School Committee, being President of the latter body in 1915. He was affiliated with many fraternal and social organizations throughout the city, and was identified in charitable work in many ways.

RESOLVED:-

That in the death of Dr. John E. Dwyer the city has lost a valued citizen. During the years 1903, '04, '05, '06 he was a member of the Board of Park Commissioners. In 1914, '15, '16 he served as a member of the School Committee, the latter year as president. In a social and fraternal way he was exceptionally active, having served as Medical Director for the Ancient Order of Hibernians for over 30 years. His activities in connection with the Holy Ghost Hospital for Incurables extended back over a period of 25 years or more and his administrations to the poor and needy of the city were well known. He was strong in the qualifications which made for good in the public service, he was conscientious in the discharge of his duties as a medical practitioner and he never failed when called upon to assist any worthy charity. The City Council hereby places on record its tribute of respect to the memory of a loyal citizen, a faithful public servant, a sincere and earnest man.
