The Committee on Roads and Bridges would submit the following report on the petition of Edward Y. White and C. B. Milder for compensation for damages to their estates by reason of a change of grade on Austin Street. They find that no change of grade has been made at the places mentioned; that Austin St. has only been repaired and put in proper condition; that a good street has been made where a poor one previously existed; and that not the slightest cause for damage exists against the City. Your Committee cannot help expressing their surprise that parties should petition for damages on so slight pretext and they would recommend that the petitioners be granted leave to withdraw.

committee are informed the petitioners
did not ask for the grade of the street when
they located their buildings but assumed the
grade from an old curb stone set many
years ago & at the expense & option of a
private individual, before we became a
city. That at the request of these
abattores the edge stones were raised at
the expense of the city & the sidewalk
filled up greatly improving rather than
damaging these estates. Your Committee
would therefore recommend that the
petitioners have leave to withdraw
