Board to lay out and establish said
Ellsworth Street as a public highway.

Ordered,

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that a new street be laid out in Ward Two, from Broadway to Cambridge Street.

Therefore Ordered, That a street extending from Broadway to Cambridge Street be laid out and a private street called Ellsworth Street, to be known and designated hereafter as "Ellsworth Avenue", and that the same be bounded and described as follows, to wit:— Beginning at the South Easterly corner of land of L. L. Raymond, on the North Easterly side of Broadway, thence running North Easterly, as the fence now stands, to the Easterly corner of land of said Raymond on the South Westerly side of Cambridge Street; Said Ellsworth Avenue to be forty feet in width, and to lie on the South Easterly side of the line above described, as shown upon a Plan made by Messrs. & Barbours, dated June 6, 1861, and now on file in the office of the City Clerk, and that, for this purpose, so much land as lies within the lines of said Ellsworth Avenue, as delineated on said Plan, be taken for public use and be laid out and established as a

public highway, as aforesaid.

Ordered, That, inasmuch as no injury is sus-
tained by any person by the taking of ^{land} ~~land~~ for
the purpose above mentioned, no damages be award-
ed to any person.
