Central Square panel seeks aid

The Central Square Committee is seeking residents of Neighborhoods 4 and 7 who are willing to volunteer their time, energy and imagination and who have a firm commitment to the revitalization of Central Square.

The office of the City Manager is now accepting letters of interest from residents who wish to actively participate in an intensive effort to revitalize Central Square. Successful candidates will be appointed by the city manager to an Economic Development Subcommittee of the Central Square Committee as representatives of the neighborhoods surrounding Central Square.

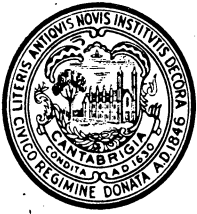
Membership of the Subcommittee will consist of four neighborhood representatives; four representatives of the business community; one institutional representative from a church or social service agency and one representative of the Community Development Department. The goal of the subcommittee will be to devise an effective action plan designed to provide a healthy economy and an attrac-

tive shopping environment resulting in a better Central Square.

Neighborhood representatives should possess the following qualifications in order to be considered for appointment: have resided in Central Square neighborhood(s) for a minimum of the past two years; be willing to meet at least every other week for one to two hours; be knowledgeable of Central Square problems; have commitment to doing research and/or reading other than at meetings; and have an understanding of business or economic development.

All residents of Neighborhoods 4 and 7 interested in serving on this subcommittee should respond by writing a letter which outlines their qualifications to Richard Rossi, Deputy City Manager, City Hall, Cambridge, MA 02139 by October 5. Minority residents are encouraged to apply.
