Recommend that the City Council not recommend the forwarding of any of the proposed sites to the landbank at this time. 3. Confirm its commitment to the creation of affordable housing in each of the neighborhoods recommended as well as others in the City; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to establish an affordable housing site committee, with representatives from the Community Development Department and Affordable Housing Trust, who will have as the main purpose of the identification of sites, and importantly the commitment to work with neighborhood groups in areas in which the City is interested in building affordable housing so that neighborhood interests are an important part of the process in the effort to build low and moderate income housing.
