This City Council learned with sorrow of the death of J. Edgar Hoover on Monday, May 1, 1972 at the age of seventy-seven, and

WHEREAS:-

J. Edgar Hoover was the head of Federal Bureau of Investigation and served the United States for forty-eight years under eight Presidents with unparalleled devotion to duty, and

WHEREAS:-

He had developed the Federal Bureau of Investigation into a powerful agency which represented the ultimate in law enforcement and earned the confidence of the American people because of the impartial administration of the criminal laws as legislated by the Congress of the United States, and
