He received numerous distinguished service awards for his studies of constituents of flame reactions. During his research at APL he served in several management positions including Vice Chair of the Milton S. Eisenhower Research Center 1975-83 and Senior Scientist of Strategic Systems 1984-1990. His degrees, all at the Carnegie Institute of Technology, in Pittsburgh, A BS in Physics and in Mathematics in 1940, MS in 1941 and a SC in 1945 in Physics. He was a Fellow of American Physical Society, Life Fellow of the American Association for Advancement of Science, Fellow of the Washington Academy of Sciences, member of the Philosophical Society of Washington, member of Cosmos Club, The Combustion Institute, The American Vacuum Society, Phi Kappa Phi and Sigma Xi. He leaves siblings, Dr. Max Foner of Memphis, TN, Mary Foner Rosenthal of Pittsfield, MA, Rachel Foner Powell of Thornville, OH, Dr. Simon Foner of Belmont, MA and David N. Foner of N. Andover, MA.
