ALICE WINN

Alice G. Winn, 51

Was assistant attorney general

Alice G. (Gilbert) Winn, an assistant attorney general for the state whose search for a bone marrow transplant donor rallied thousands of supporters, died of leukemia yesterday in Brigham and Women's Hospital. She was 51.

Mrs. Winn, of Brookline, had been ill for six months and was the subject of a Globe column by Brian McGrory describing her search for a donor. As an Ashkenazi Jew, her chances were slim to find a matching donor because the majority of the 6 million Jews killed in the Holocaust were Ashkenazi. Despite the odds, about 4,000 people registered at a January donor drive to see if they matched.

Mrs. Winn was raised in Huntington, N.Y. She graduated from Boston University and later received a master's degree in Spanish literature from Columbia University and a law degree from Suffolk University Law School.

She had been an assistant state attorney general since 1982.

Before passing the bar exam, she taught Spanish at the secondary and college levels.

Mrs. Winn was a trustee of the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute and of Facing History and Ourselves. She also was on the board of the New England Region of the Anti-Defamation League.

She leaves her husband, Arthur M., two daughters, Jennifer and Rebecca, both of New York City; a son, Gilbert, of Brookline; and two brothers, Steven and Jonathan.

A funeral will be held tomorrow at 11 a.m. in Temple Israel in Boston. Burial will be in Sharon Memorial Park.
