Also funded: Beth Weimann's string quartet, "Jerusalem the Golden" premiered in Cambridge during American Music Week, Playwrights' Platform's just completed fall festival of new works, Derek Te Paske's videodocumentary, "Mission of Mercy" at the Cambridge Public Library, and a tour of the City's nursing homes by Southern Rail Bluegrass; and
- WHEREAS: A prime event attached to National Arts Week which the Cambridge Arts Council has organized, is "Election Excitement '88", a benefit performance on the Capital Steps to augment the City's contribution to the arts, as well as a special presentation of the 2nd Annual Arts Award in honor of National Arts Week.
