RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Leaman family on behalf of the entire City Council.

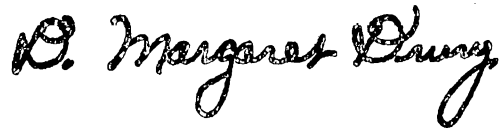

WHEREAS: Jack was a U. S. Army veteran; and

WHEREAS: Jack was a graduate of the Cambridge High and Latin School and Boston University; and

WHEREAS: Jack led the BU Terriers to the NCAA Basketball Tournament in 1959; and

WHEREAS: Jack spent 18 seasons with the University of Massachusetts Minutemen, with the last 13 season as its head Basketball coach; and

WHEREAS: During Jack's tenure, the Minutemen won eight Yankee Conference Championships, made six appearances at the National Invitational Tournament; and

WHEREAS: Jack was the coach of the former NBA great, Julius Erving, the former Boston Celtic Coach and present University of Louisville coach, Rick Pitino, and the Boston College coach, Al Skinner; and

WHEREAS: Jack was also the head Coach for the UMASS women's team for the 1986-1987 season, and then an assistant coach from 1991-1994; and

WHEREAS: Jack has been the radio voice of the UMASS Minutemen since 1994; and

WHEREAS: Jack was inducted into the Boston University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1977, the UMASS Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998, and the New England Basketball Hall of Fame in 2003; and
