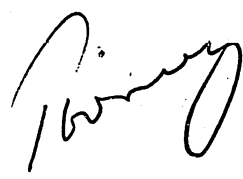

May 13 - Area IV, Maynard School lot, Harvard and Windsor Streets

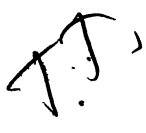
May 20 - North Cambridge, 362-364 Rindge Ave. parking lot

May 27 - Riverside/Cambridgeport, parking lot at Sydney and Lansdowne Streets

Permission slips can be obtained from the Police Dept., area bicycle shops and youth centers, and at the Bicycle Safety Rodeos (signed on the spot by the parent or guardian.) Slips will also be distributed through the schools.
