- WHEREAS: Caroline was a best-selling author; two of her books, *Drinking: A Love Story* and *Pack of Two*; The Intricate Bond between People and Dogs became New York Times list best sellers; and
- WHEREAS: Beginning in 1988 Caroline wrote a weekly column for the Boston Phoenix that developed a cult following among some local readers; several of her columns were published as a collection in her first book, *Alice K's Guide to Life: One Woman's Quest for Survival, Sanity and the Perfect Shoes*; and
- WHEREAS: Caroline's passing will leave a void in the lives of all of her surviving friends and family, her husband Mike Morelli, her twin sister Rebecca S., her brother Andrew G., her half-sister Penelope, her half-brother Peter and her dog Lucille; and
- WHEREAS: Caroline will be sorely missed by all she touched and loved; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of Caroline Knapp at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
