- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Nicholas E. Christopher, former owner of a florist shop on Church Street in Harvard Square; and
- WHEREAS: Nicholas was born in Ipswich and educated in its local schools, and he served his country during World War II as a member of the United States Army; and
- WHEREAS: During the Depression in 1929 Nicholas left high school in his senior year in order to help provide for his family and began working for his uncle at the Brattle Square Florist, where he worked continuously for thirty-five years until he opened his own shop known as Christopher's Flowers on Church Street, a shop he maintained for many years, selling and giving flowers away to his customers and friends; people who thought enough of him to organize a surprise party in his honor at the Harvard Faculty Club in 1982; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire Christopher family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Christopher family on behalf of the entire City Council.
