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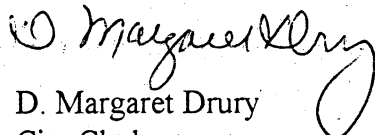

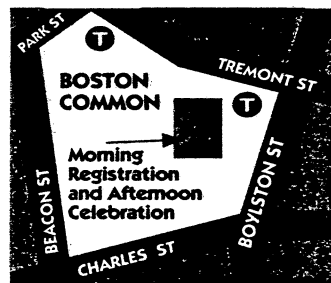
ABOUT THE CITY YEAR SERVE-A-THON

Dear Councilors;

We are excited to report that the City Year program has chosen Central Square for inclusion in the Day of Service campaign, scheduled for Saturday, October 22, 1994.

As you may be aware, the City Year program organizes volunteer efforts to work on community problems and issues. It is expected that at least fifty volunteers will be available to work during the day on the 22nd. At a meeting last week with Ms. Linda Markarian of City Year, Mr. Ralph Dunphy, Commissioner of the Public Works Dept. and myself, the following list of projects was created:
