RE: Senate Bill S.66 Compromise and Council Resolution

On March 6, 1983 the National League of Cities and the National Cable Television Association reached a compromise agreement of cable legislation (S.66) to be recommended to Congress for enactment.

On April 21, S.66 along with the compromise agreements was passed in Committee 15-2 and will come up on the Senate floor for a full vote sometime in late May. Although the compromise reflects some improvement of the original bill, there remain a number of serious problems affecting the ability of Cambridge and other cities and towns to determine tele-communications policy. Should you, the Honorable Members of the Cambridge City Council approve of Cambridge's positions listed below it is recommended that copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Massachusetts House and Senate Delegation.

City of Cambridge

Opposition to Senate Bill 66 (Compromise)

SUBSCRIBER PRIVACY RIGHTS

Compromise: Gives exclusive control of subscriber privacy rights to the Federal Government.

Cambridge's Position: Supports Federal Government subscriber privacy rights as minimum standards. Cambridge does not believe that the Federal Government should have exclusive jurisdictions to establish rules and regulations for subscriber privacy rights.

THIRD PARTY OR LEASED ACCESS

Compromise: No licensing authority shall have authority to impose upon an operator regulations of a common carrier.

Cambridge's
Position: Leased access channel capacity to third parties on an open and non-discriminatory basis is essential to the democratic process and will ensure the free flow of information to the public. Therefore, this should be a negotiable provision.

RENEWAL OF LICENSE

Compromise: Cable operator has an automatic expectation of renewal and may appeal to the courts if approval is denied.

Renewal process unfairly places the burden of evidence regarding a licensee's performance on the city or town.

Cambridge's
Position: The licensee should be required to establish its case for renewal. Furthermore, this compromise makes it difficult for the city to negotiate system improvements based on the city's needs.

RATE DEREGULATION

Compromise: Allows operators to increase rates up to 5% annually without approval and completely deregulates rates within five (5) years.

Cambridge's
Position: This stipulation strips cities and towns across the country of power to protect the subscriber from unreasonable and unjustified rate increases and promulgates discrimination in access to the system. (Rates in Massachusetts are already deregulated.)

In conclusion, this compromise S.66 establishes fixed federal standards for an industry subject to quickly changing technical and local market conditions and is harmful to cities both large and small. Legislation should not be enacted which prohibits localities from establishing standards that address local needs in areas traditionally reserved to localities, provided they are consistent with minimum federal standards.

Cambridge's
Position: Regulation at the local level should be given the broadest possible scope.
