COUNCILLOR PREUSSER

- WHEREAS:** The Youth March For Jobs, Rally, Vigil and Lobby in Washington, D.C. this April 8th will be urging a massive Jobs For Youth Program, with special efforts in areas of heaviest unemployment and passage of the Humphrey-Hawkins Bill; and
- WHEREAS:** It is the 10th Anniversary (April 4th) of the death of Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; and
- WHEREAS:** It is the time when concern over summer jobs for millions of additional youth will be at its height and budget priorities will be under debate in Congress; and
- WHEREAS:** The social consequences of 3 million young people — 40% black teenagers — chronically jobless requires no comment; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That this City Council go on public record in support of the Youth March For Jobs; and be it further
- RESOLVED:** That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to appropriate as soon as possible a sum sufficient to allow a small representative group of our youth to participate in this march.
