To The Honorable, The City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of \$362,990.00 in the Grant Fund of the Department of Human Services Salaries & Wages Account (\$214,960.00), Other Ordinary Maintenance Account (\$139,390.00) and Travel and Training Account (\$8,640.00) from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration. The Center for Substance Abuse Prevention of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services has awarded this grant to the Planning and Development Division to act as the lead agency of the Cambridge Prevention Coalition. This appropriation is the third award of a three year grant. The purpose of this grant is to build a coalition of agencies, organizations and partnerships aimed at reducing alcohol, tobacco and other drug use, and to integrate substance abuse prevention into managed health care systems. Coalitions members include the Cambridge Substance Abuse Task Force, the Health of the City partnership and the Cambridge Hospital Community Health Network. These funds will be used to pay for Prevention Coalition staff, benefits, operating costs and travel.
