

To the Mayor and Aldermen
of the City of Cambridge

Leather Slater of
said City represents that said
City assessed three hundred dollars
upon his lot of land of about
one hundred feet square on the
corner of Temple and Currier
streets in said City, on account
of widening said Temple street
about six feet on its westerly
side throughout its whole length,
which sum he had paid; that
said sum was much more than
ought to have been assessed upon
said property, considering its
value and the benefit received
by it from said widening, and
much more than was assessed
upon the other property on said
Temple street, according to the value
of said other property and the benefit
^{to} by the same from said widening;
that some abatement or reduction

of assessments upon other property
on the same street, has already been
made, although it was not assessed
more than your petitioners, according
to its value and the benefit it
received by said widening.

Now therefore on account
of said inequalities of assessments
and considering that he is as justly
entitled to have a part of his
said assessment refunded to
him as said others were to have
theirs reduced, your petitioners
pray said city to reduce his
said assessment and refund
to him such part thereof
as is just and reasonable.
