## NCC volleyball players honored

Three members of the North Cambridge Catholic High School girls varsity volleyball team were honored recently for their selection as Catholic Suburban league all-stars. Senior co-captains Lisa Marie LeBlanc and Valerie Christphonte, along with junior Karina Woodard, received their awards at league ceremonies held Dec. 7 at St. Clements High School. LeBlanc, the team's setter, and Christphonte, NCC's strongest hitter

and server, were starters on the varsity team for four consecutive years. The Panther duo led NCC to a strong second-place finish in the CSL behind undefeated St. Clements. This is the fourth time that LeBlanc has been chosen as an all-star, and the third time for Christphonte.

Woodard, a two-year varsity starter, was the team's best passer and probably the most consistent player on this year's Panther squad. A first-time all-star, Woodard is one of only two juniors who will return to next year's varsity team.

## Starring in field hockey

Alexis Scott, a forward on the St. Mark's varsity field hockey team helped lead her team to the Small School New England Prep championship and second place in the Independent School League this year. For her stellar play, Scott earned all-league recognition and was elected co-captain of next year's team.

The Ordinance Committee held a public hearing on Monday, July 12, 1993, beginning at 8:35 p.m. in the Sullivan Chamber, Cambridge City Hall, for the purpose of considering a proposed amendment to Sec.5.36.060 of the Municipal Ordinances to include Cambridge Street between Sumner Street and Maple Avenue as a restricted area for hawkers and peddlers. Present at the hearing were Councillor Alice K. Wolf, Chair of the Committee, Mayor Kenneth E. Reeves, Vice Mayor Edward N. Cyr, Councillor Francis H. Duehay, Councillor Jonathan S. >Myers, Councillor Sheila T. Russell, Councillor Timothy J. Toomey, Hr., and Councillor William H. Walsh.

Councillor Wolf explained the subject of the hearing.

Councillor Duehay said that he was not sure that the existing ordinances regarding peddlers and hawkers were being enforced effectively. He requested that the Chair confer with the City Manager with the view in mind of appointing a subcommittee from departments that work with these ordinances, including the City Clerk, Law Department, License Commission, Department of Public Works, and Police Department, to review all peddler, hawker and related ordinances to determine how well existing ordinances are working and whether new ones are required.

Councillor Wolf requested public testimony on the proposed amendment.

Thomas P. Weed, 14 Foster Street said that this proposed amendment may restrict one of the remedies to unemployment, which is self employment. The Council should carefully consider its potential side effects in this area before making additional restrictions.

No other testimony being offered, Councillor Wolf closed this portion of the hearing.

Mayor Reeves stated that he recalled a case where the applicant was from out-of-town, and consideration of whether he should be allowed a permit took up way too much time of both the Council and city employees. He added that the permit is very inexpensive, and it is not fair to allow this kind of competition to our Cambridge businesses who pay taxes and much higher overhead. Mayor Reeves said that perhaps the cost of the permits should be reviewed, and that he supports Councillor Duehay's suggestion that a committee be appointed to look at the issues raised by these permits, including whether the charge for permits should be increased.

Councillor Toomey said that he had sponsored an order requesting that the City Manager look into whether permits for canteen trucks at city construction sites could be limited to Cambridge residents, and he asked the City Clerk to inquire as to the status of that order. Councillor Russell said that she had also sponsored that order and was interested in the outcome.

Councillor Russell moved referral of the proposed amendment to the full City Council.

The motion failed on a roll call vote.

Councillor Duehay moved that the Chair confer with the City Manager with the view in mind of appointing a subcommittee from departments that work with these ordinances, including the City Clerk, Law Department, License Commission, Department of Public Works, and Police Department, to review all peddler, hawker and related ordinances to determine how well existing ordinances are working and whether new ones are required. The motion carried on a unanimous voice vote.

Upon the motion of Councillor Russell, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.

Be it ordained by the City Council

Chapter 22 of the General Ordina-  
nces of the City of Cambridge  
entitled "Peddlers" is hereby  
amended by adding at the end  
thereof the following new section:—

Section 10.

No person shall; within the lim-  
its of Memorial Drive on the south  
from the Western Avenue Bridge  
to Hawthorn Street, to Mount Au-  
burn Street, to Ash Street, to Ma-  
son Street, to Garden Street, to  
Chauncy Street, to Everett Street,  
to Oxford Street, to Kirkland Street,  
to Trowbridge Street, to Putnam  
Square to Putnam Avenue, to West-  
ern Avenue and return to Memorial  
Drive at the Western Avenue  
Bridge; hawk or peddle, sell or ex-  
pose for sale, distribute or give  
away goods, wares or merchandise  
within the confines of the above  
described area except when author-  
ized to do so by Chapter 101 of the  
General Laws and acts in amend-  
ment thereof or in addition thereto,  
except under a permit issued by the  
Chief of Police of the City of Cam-  
bridge. The provisions of this sec-  
tion shall not apply to the sale of  
newspapers. Any person violating  
the provisions of this section shall  
be punished by a fine not exceed-  
ing twenty dollars for each offense.



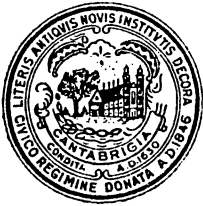

*Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:*

Chapter 2.58 of the Code (Officers and Employees Generally) is hereby amended by striking out §2.58.010 thereof and substituting the following new §2.58.010:

2.58.010 Residency requirement - Exception

A. Every person, who, on or after the effective date of this section ( , 1993), is first employed by the City of Cambridge, shall become a domiciled resident of the City within one year from the date of such employment, and shall remain a domiciled resident thereof during the term of such employment.

B. This section shall not apply to City employees who are specifically allowed by statute to reside outside City limits.

The Ordinance Committee held a public hearing on Monday, July 12, 1993, beginning at 8:35 p.m. in the Sullivan Chamber, Cambridge City Hall, for the purpose of considering a proposed amendment to Sec.5.36.060 of the Municipal Ordinances to include Cambridge Street between Sumner Street and Maple Avenue as a restricted area for hawkers and peddlers. Present at the hearing were Councillor Alice K. Wolf, Chair of the Committee, Mayor Kenneth E. Reeves, Vice Mayor Edward N. Cyr, Councillor Francis H. Duehay, Councillor Jonathan S. Myers, Councillor Sheila T. Russell, Councillor Timothy J. Toomey, Hr., and Councillor William H. Walsh.

Councillor Wolf explained the subject of the hearing.

Councillor Duehay said that he was not sure that the existing ordinances regarding peddlers and hawkers were being enforced effectively. He requested that the Chair confer with the City Manager with the view in mind of appointing a subcommittee from departments that work with these ordinances, including the City Clerk, Law Department, License Commission, Department of Public Works, and Police Department, to review all peddler, hawker and related ordinances to determine how well existing ordinances are working and whether new ones are required.

Councillor Wolf requested public testimony on the proposed amendment.

Thomas P. Weed, 14 Foster Street said that this proposed amendment may restrict one of the remedies to unemployment, which is self employment. The Council should carefully consider its potential side effects in this area before making additional restrictions.

No other testimony being offered, Councillor Wolf closed this portion of the hearing.

Mayor Reeves stated that he recalled a case where the applicant was from out-of-town, and consideration of whether he should be allowed a permit took up way too much time of both the Council and city employees. He added that the permit is very inexpensive, and it is not fair to allow this kind of competition to our Cambridge businesses who pay taxes and much higher overhead. Mayor Reeves said that perhaps the cost of the permits should be reviewed, and that he supports Councillor Duehay's suggestion that a committee be appointed to look at the issues raised by these permits, including whether the charge for permits should be increased.

Councillor Toomey said that he and Councillor Wolf had sponsored an order requesting that the City Manager look into whether permits for canteen trucks at city construction sites could be limited to Cambridge residents, and he asked the City Clerk to inquire as to the status of that order. Councillor Russell said that she had also sponsored that order and was interested in the outcome.

Councillor Russell moved referral of the proposed amendment to the full City Council.

The motion failed on a roll call vote.

Councillor Duehay moved that the Chair confer with the City Manager with the view in mind of appointing a subcommittee from departments that work with these ordinances, including the City Clerk, Law Department, License Commission, Department of Public Works, and Police Department, to review all peddler, hawker and related ordinances to determine how well existing ordinances are working and whether new ones are required. The motion carried on a unanimous voice vote.

Upon the motion of Councillor Russell, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.
