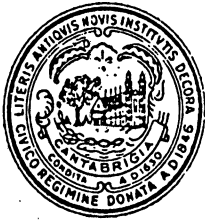


Enclosed is a copy of an order which will be introduced by Councillor Sullivan at the City Council meeting of November 22, 1976 relative to the Police Commissioner ordinance.

You will recall that the City Council on November 8, 1976 passed to be ordained this ordinance at which time Councillor Sullivan notified the City Clerk of his intention to move reconsideration at the meeting of November 15th, 1976. Councillor Sullivan moved reconsideration and the proposed ordinance was reconsidered. The ordinance was then reconsidered and when put to final vote failed of ordination.

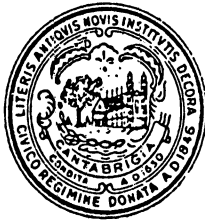

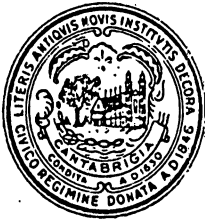

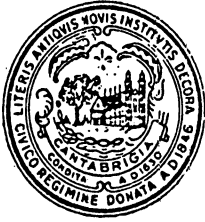
