- WHEREAS: A recent article in the Cambridge Chronicle entitled "School Surrenders to Brattle Street Neighbors" outlines the brief life and untimely death of a school which catered mainly to minorities; and
- WHEREAS: The neighborhood surrounding the little school, which is made up largely of Harvard Professors, well known business people and other professionals, pooled their collective talent and successfully, forced them out financially, despite the full support given the school by the Board of Zoning Appeal; and
- WHEREAS: The death of anything especially an opportunity for little children to share in the rich historical heritage of Brattle Street, Longfellow Park and the environs of our universities, makes it a time for all of us to mourn and show our mourning publicly; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Mayor, as Chairman of the School Committee, order all flags in front of City schools flown at half mast for one day to mourn the passing of a school and also to forward a copy of this resolution to the Chairman of the Mass. Commission Against Discrimination and to the Federal Civil Rights Commission.
